Tuition: \$46/semester credit hour

Application : Filing period begins November of Senior Year

A - G REQUIREMENTS



A. History/Social Studies	2 years required
B. English	4 years required
C. Mathematics	3 years required (4 years recommended)
D. Laboratory Science	2 years required (3 years recommended)
E. Language other than English	2 years required (3 years recommended)
F. Visual and Performing Arts	1 year required
G. College Prep Electives	1 year required

Grades of “C” or better are required in all college prep courses

Admissions: A - G completion, SAT/ACT, Comprehensive Review (24 areas), SAT II Subject test recommended, targets top 12% of graduating class

Application: Begin filing October 1st senior year

PRIVATE FOUR YEAR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Tuition: 35k - 55k per year

Admissions: Each school has its own admissions criteria, although all require A - G type pattern, the SAT/ACT, comprehensive review, and sometimes a personal interview

Application: Begin filing September 1st of senior year

 - Students may take as many as three exams in one day. Many subject options are available
- ◎ ACT + Writing

HOW CAN I PREPARE FOR COLLEGE RIGHT NOW AND THROUGH THE END OF THIS SEMESTER?

- ◉ Stay in the challenging classes and perform well in them (grades 10th and 11th are reported to colleges)
- ◉ Start thinking about what you want to study after high school
- ◉ Research post-secondary institutions, begin compiling a list
- ◉ Register to take the SAT and/or ACT if planning to apply to a four year college
- ◉ Sign up for junior/senior courses (March)
- ◉ Plan, research and apply for summer school/work experiences
- ◉ Begin to lay the groundwork for teacher recommendations
- ◉ Visit prospective colleges

SUMMER AFTER JUNIOR/SOPHOMORE YEAR

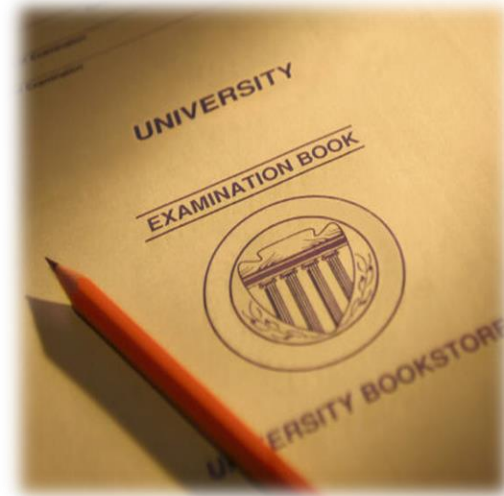
- ◉ Summer school college course(s)
- ◉ Summer college residential experience
- ◉ Secure local employment
- ◉ Visit prospective colleges
- ◉ Begin to narrow your post-secondary school choices/options
- ◉ Register for the SAT and/or ACT (junior students only)

AUGUST/SEPTEMBER

- ◉ Register for the SAT and/or ACT - need to be completed before December test date
- ◉ Attend College Night at Bakersfield Convention Center
- ◉ Request letters of recommendation from teachers/counselor
- ◉ Attend college presentations in the Resource Center
- ◉ Narrow your post-secondary school list. Most experts recommend making applications to three to six colleges. One choice should be a “dream” school and one a “backup”
- ◉ University of California application becomes available in the month of September
- ◉ Many private colleges/universities, and out of state colleges begin making applications available.

OCTOBER

- ◉ The CSU and UC application window opens up on October 1st.
- ◉ Attend the UC application workshop on campus
- ◉ Attend the on-site admission event for the CSU
- ◉ Begin review on the “Scholarship Scoop” for scholarship opportunities - available in the Resource Center and on the web
- ◉ Financial Aid Workshop-File the FAFSA



NOVEMBER

- ◉ File UC and CSU applications. Deadline is November 30th.
- ◉ File the Bakersfield College Enrollment Application (workshop at Stockdale) ALL STUDENTS ARE RECOMMENDED TO DO THIS
- ◉ Take the ASVAB exam - interest inventory. Note: This is NOT a commitment to the military
- ◉ Make applications via the COMMON APPLICATION to private colleges/universities

DECEMBER/JANUARY

- ◉ Participate in the Bakersfield College Orientation (on campus Stockdale) in December
- ◉ January generally makes the deadline to apply to private colleges and universities, out of state public colleges
- ◉ Attend the Financial Aid Workshop, conducted in January at Stockdale High School. You will learn information on how to file the FAFSA, and how to fund college
- ◉ File the FAFSA by March 2nd.
- ◉ Midyear reports for colleges are generally due
- ◉ Participate in the BC Assessment January at Stockdale

FEBRUARY - APRIL

- ◉ Continue to work hard in your courses
- ◉ Continue to apply for scholarships through the Resource Center
- ◉ Receive letters of acceptance/rejection/waitlist
- ◉ Participate in the Bakersfield College Academic counseling session (Stockdale High School-February)
- ◉ Receive financial aid and scholarship offers
- ◉ Register for Bakersfield College courses April 1st.
- ◉ Make final post-secondary decisions

MAY/JUNE

- ◉ Finish strong in your courses
- ◉ Make final plans for college and summer work
- ◉ Graduation
- ◉ Send final transcript to college you are attending. This can be done through the Registrar's Office
